

ParkPlay in Herts Impact Report 2023-24

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Introduction

ParkPlay is a programme that provides a wonderful opportunity for individuals of all ages in Hertfordshire to engage in two hours of free community play every Saturday from 10am to 12pm in a park, school or public area. This initiative is perfect for those who might not typically take part in conventional sports. It offers engaging, fun, informal games, so that participants can stay active almost without even realising it whilst enjoying quality time with family, friends, and the local community.

Project background

ParkPlay promotes outdoor physical activity and fosters community engagement. The Hertfordshire programme was commissioned by Hertfordshire County Council through their Building Life Chance Funding. The Partnership was tasked with coordinating and implementing the development of ParkPlay across at least 8 sites within the county.



Implementation

To date Herts Sport & Physical Activity Partnership (HSP) has successfully launched ParkPlay at three locations:

- Broxbourne Cedar's Park
- Letchworth Jackmans Creamery
- Borehamwood Aycliffe Park

In addition to the funding provided by the County
Council, HSP has partnered with each local authority
to support the selection of individual sites, the selection of play leaders
and to generally support the development and promotion of the
programme. To date the programme has received financial support
from North Herts Council, Hertsmere Borough Council and Broxbourne
Borough Council.

The programme also requires each site to have a Play Leader who is either employed or volunteers from a local community organisation. It is these organisations that are responsible for the Saturday morning delivery of the programme. In Hertfordshire the programme uses three different organisations in this role InspireAll (Aycliffe), Active in The Community (Jackmans Creamery) and Time for Change (Cedars).



HSP's role is to facilitate the launch of ParkPlay events by working with the Local Authority and local community partners as well as the day-to-day liaison with the ParkPlay national team.

Plans and agreements are in place to extend future ParkPlay programmes throughout the county, including Welwyn Garden City, South Oxhey, Stevenage, Watford, Bishop's Stortford, and Hemel Hempstead over the next 18 months.

These programmes have been funded through Hertfordshire County Council Building Life Chances funding, District and Borough Council contributions and the Department of Education's Opening School Facilities Fund. HSP and partners see the initiative playing a vital role in strengthening communities, improving well-being, and tackling issues related to social isolation and mental health.

The programme will continue to expand with the introductions of new partnerships between individual sites, park play leaders and community groups.
