



The Five Outcomes

The five School Games outcomes ensure that there is a clear direction and a collective ask to the School Games network to work towards the same priorities for young people in Year 3 to 13 across all education settings.


- To advocate and position the delivery of the CMO daily active minutes for all young people, as a universal offer to maintain and grow school engagement¹
- To ensure all competition has a clear intent and creates positive experiences 2 based on the motivation, competence and confidence of the young people that need our support the most
- 3 To have a clear focus on secondary school engagement and transition points
- 4 To support the personal development of targeted young people through youth engagement and leadership
- To advocate and engage key stakeholders² on the value of School Games to support local provision and improve the experience for young people and their families

In order to focus on the three pledges – as SGO's we are looking to target specific inequalities, physical literacy and youth engagement: School Games National data





Less active (less than 30 mins activity a day)






Active (an average of an hour a day)


Aiming to enhance service provision through a joined-up approach using evidence-based methodologies, alignment of professional practice, meaningful evaluation and improved access by young people.

Proposal:


- Commission specific organisations to improve / change / grow the current primary offer.

- Comprehensive Training Package.











- Unique offer/ Flexible
- Costings of the offer.
- Curricular PE/Secondary schools focus KS4/KS5, offer alternative sports / any links to funding?
- Look at school games /district calendars Can you offer any support?
- Cross Curricular themes Projects that may include science, numeracy and literacy but delivered in a practical way.
- Health agenda/obesity/mental health.
