- Sport England's Response to The Whyte Review
- One of 19 implementations introduced.

Main responsibilities

- Non-case management role
- To add capacity and expertise to the existing safeguarding work of NGBs and Active Partnerships
- To promote good welfare practice and safe sport at a local level
- To support club environments to move from welfare compliance to effective culture
- Connect people working on welfare inside and outside of sport, as well as across sports – including LADO.
- Training of Club Welfare Officers – training programmes, forums, in situ visits etc
